The 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Special Olympics Unified Sports® Awards Banquet hosted by the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference (CIAC) and Special Olympics Connecticut was attended by more than 900 student athletes and Unified Sports® partners, coaches, teachers, administrators, family members, and special honorees representing 94 high schools and middle schools across the state. It was an evening to celebrate those who play Unified and live Unified and schools that promote acceptance and inclusion for all in sports, in classroom, and beyond the schoolground.
